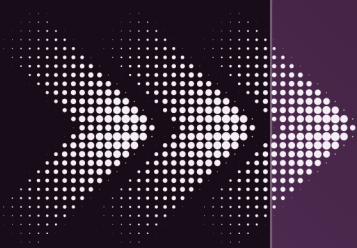


5 Steps

To Closing The Security Visibility Gap



How to turn scattered security tools, reports, and alerts into a clear security program.

The gap is bigger than reporting

The security visibility gap is not just a missing report. It is the space between the work happening in the background and the clarity leaders need to make decisions.



Scattered signals

Too much noise.
Hard to see what matters.



Clear understanding

Right insight.
Stronger outcomes.

The goal is not more data. The goal is clearer direction.



Identify Where Security Data Lives

Visibility breaks down when security information is spread across too many places



What to do

1

Map the sources

List every place security data is created or stored.

2

Note who owns them

Identify the team or person responsible for each source.

3

Spot blind spots

Find data that isn't monitored, correlated, or reported.

Separate Activity From Insight

Data only becomes valuable when it helps explain meaning and next steps.

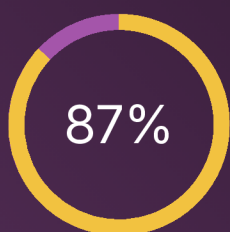

Define What Leaders Need To See

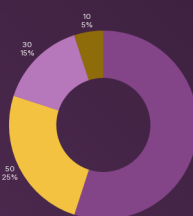
Business leaders do not need more noises. They need a clear view of what matters.

1. What's protected vs. vulnerable



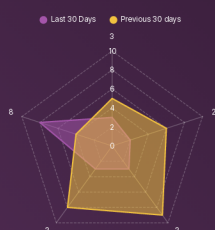
Show the strength of your coverage across endpoints, identities, and cloud apps

2. What Needs Attention



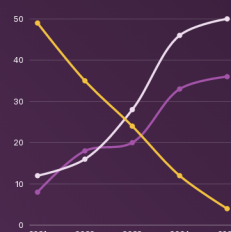

Turn Visibility Into Priorities

Visibility only matters if it helps you decide what to do first, next, and later.

First

Fixes



- High risk and high impact
- Active threats or exposures
- Quick wins that reduce risk

Next

Plan & Budget



- Important but not urgent
- Requires coordination or spend
- Build roadmap and timeline

Monitor

Keep Watch



- Lower risk or lower impact
- Track for changes or trends
- Reassess over time



What to do

1



Assign Ownership
Make sure someone is accountable

2



Tie to Business Impact
Focus on what reduces risk and drives value.

3



Revisit Regularly
Priorities change. Stay aligned.

Build A Managed Rythm For Improvement

Security visibility should support an ongoing cadence, not a one-time report.

Create a practical cadence

Cadence	Review	Output
 Monthly Review	• Changes in risk • Open issues • Key alerts • Completed actions	 Updated priorities and assigned follow-up
 Quarterly Planning	• Trends • Control gaps • Recurring issues • Major risk	 Roadmap updates, budget or policy decisions, next initiatives
 Ongoing Follow-Through	• Remediation status • Owners • Deadlines • Blockers	 Progress tracking and accountability
Tip: Keep it consistent. A steady cadence drives better decisions.		

Visibility only matters if it leads to action.

The goal is not more reporting. The goal is a clear rhythm for decisions, accountability, and measurable improvement.

Close the Gap With Managed Security.

When strategy, reporting, and expert oversight come together, security becomes easier to understand and improve.
